



Tired of short life shingles? Wanting something that can stay in place as the winds blow? Astounded by the price of 'permanent' roofing materials? Then you are where I was.

This spring once the weather changed I got to work on the roof. Now it took me longer than if I had put on asphalt shingles, but I was learning as I went. Consulting the DVD instructions on my laptop [conveniently set up in the garage] I found it very easy to follow the step by step instructions. As I got into it, I found I was enjoying the work. When I found one oddity we hadn't covered in my roof I simply e-mailed a picture of it to them and they replied with technical advice graphed on over my own picture.

The roof is now done. I have sent them pictures of it. It looks great. Many of my neighbours have complimented it. I have the assurance, that unless I move from this house, I should not face an expensive roofing job in my retirement.
